The Regional Transportation District (RTD) is once again offering bicycle commuters free bike parking during Bike to Work Week, June 23-27 from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., as an incentive to get them out of their cars and onto bikes for their daily commutes. Commuters can take advantage of free valet parking at the large, supervised tent at 16th and Market, and then enjoy refreshments and giveaway items provided by sponsors of the event. All commuters who park at the RTD Bike Station will be entered into a drawing for various bicycle-related prizes. On Bike to Work Day, June 25, commuters will be treated to more refreshments and giveaways donated by local businesses. Because security and transportation planning is ongoing and details continue to evolve, more specifics will be available in the coming weeks. Ongoing updates will be disseminated widely and available through a variety of sources.

Designated Parade Route for the Democratic National Convention

The City and County of Denver announced the details of the Designated Parade Route to be available during the Democratic National Convention in late August for groups seeking to march toward the Pepsi Center. Details of additional transportation impacts are still being finalized and will be announced in the coming weeks, but City officials underscore that downtown will be accessible and inconveniences to local residents, employees and businesses will be minimized. Denver's Designated Parade Route will be available all four days of the Convention (August 25-28, 2008) between the hours of 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. Over the next week, the City will work with the organizations that requested use of the Designated Parade Route to accommodate as many groups as possible in a fair and transparent manner. The Designated Parade Route will begin at 11:00 a.m. on the north side of Colfax Avenue in the westbound traffic lanes at Bannock Street and proceed west toward Speer Boulevard, where marchers will proceed north on the southbound lanes of Speer Boulevard to Larimer Street. The parade route will end within walking distance of the 50,000+ square-foot demonstration zone located in Pepsi Center parking lot A. Details of the route from Speer Boulevard and Larimer

Street to the route terminus within walking distance of the public demonstration zone are still being finalized and will be announced in the coming weeks. As is standard safety protocol for parade routes, prominent signage designating the route and traffic management/safety personnel along the route will be provided. Ski Train Summer Season Starts June 21

If the Ski Train trip to activity-filled summer fun

at Winter Park Resort doesn't make grownups

feel like kids again, at least the train fare will.

That's because adults of all ages traveling in coach will pay the children's rate, \$39, \$10 off the regular \$49 adult coach fare, for the first two day-trips of the summer Ski Train season. The train will travel to Winter Park on Saturdays June 21 through August 23. The Ski Train to Winter Park Resort is a way to escape from the city - and from high gasoline prices - without having to hassle with traffic. The train will leave Denver's Union Station at 9:00 a.m.; the return trip will depart from Winter Park at 3:00 p.m. Beginning July 5, the regular round-trip adult coach fare will be \$49. For the entire summer, the fares are \$39 for children 12 and under, \$39 for seniors 62 or older and \$39 for members of groups of 12 or more. All Club Car tickets are \$74 and include a continental breakfast, snacks and non-alcoholic beverages on the return trip.
